# NO PUBLIC HEARING REQUIRED

REQUEST: Adoption of findings for Guidelines for reduction or waiver of street dedication, prepared pursuant to LAMC 12.37-A.5.

SUMMARY: The attached Guidelines and Checklist (Exhibit E-1) were prepared by the Street Standards Committee pursuant to LAMC 12.37-A.5. That Code section requires that the Guidelines be found by the Planning Commission to be consistent with the goals and purpose of the Transportation Element of the General Plan in order for the Guidelines to be utilized by the City Engineer.

#### **SUMMARY**

On April 26,1999 the City Council adopted an amendment to Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) Section 12.37 (Highway and Collector Street Dedication - Exhibit E-2 attached) which included a new provision enabling the City Engineer to waive or reduce required public street dedications "based on guidelines established by the Street Standards Committee". Such guidelines were to include a notification procedure, and must be determined by the City Planning Commission to be "consistent with the goals and purpose of the Transportation Element of the General Plan". The Director of Planning hereby transmits to the Commission the Guidelines/Checklist and notification procedure established by the Street Standards Committee (Exhibit E-1).

Recommendations: That the Planning Commission -

- 1. Adopt this staff report as its report on this matter;
- 2. Adopt the Findings set forth below;
- 3. Instruct the Director of Planning to transmit to the City Engineer the attached Guidelines/Checklist (Exhibit E-1) along with the report of this Commission action.

#### **FINDINGS**

The Director of Planning recommends that the City Planning Commission find that the attached Guidelines/Checklist (Exhibit E-1) are consistent with the goals and purpose of the Transportation Element of the General Plan, in that:

- 1. The purpose of the Transportation Element is "to present a guide to the further development of a citywide transportation system which provides for the efficient movement of people and goods". Congruent with this purpose, the Element sets forth three explicit goals -
  - Goal A Adequate accessibility to work opportunities and essential services, and acceptable levels of mobility for all those who live, work, travel or move goods in Los Angeles.
  - Goal B A street system maintained in good to excellent condition adequate to facilitate the movement of those reliant on the system.
  - Goal C An integrated system of pedestrian priority street segments, bikeways and scenic highways which strengthens the City's image while also providing access to employment opportunities, essential services and open space.

- 2. The Guidelines/Checklist as established by the Street Standards Committee are consistent with the purpose of the Transportation Element as they relate to guidance of further development of the arterial and collector street system in the City in a rational, strategic manner.
- 3. The Guidelines/Checklist are consistent with Goal A of the Transportation Element as they relate directly to issues of mobility by linking new building permit activity to development of the arterial and collector street system with a focus on congested corridors and transit priority arterials, utilizing traffic volume performance standards for the various street designations as set forth in the Transportation Element.
- 4. The Guidelines/Checklist are consistent with Goal B of the Transportation Element as they relate directly to the issue of street maintenance by linking new building permit activity to street improvements/reconstruction along the City's most heavily traveled street segments.
- 5. The Guidelines/Checklist are consistent with Goal C of the Transportation Element as they relate directly to the issue of non-motorized transportation by linking new building permit activity to development of the City's designated bikeway system and to implementation of the new wider standard for sidewalks in the Major Class I and Major Class II highway designations.
- 6. The Director of Planning further recommends that the Planning Commission find that the Guidelines/Checklist are exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Article III, Section 2, Subsection (m) of the City's CEQA Guidelines (actions which do not of themselves have an impact on the physical environment).

# STAFF REPORT

# Background

Section 17.05-A of the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) establishes a Street Standards Committee, to be composed of the Director of Planning (Chair), the General Manager of the Department of Transportation (LADOT) and the City Engineer. It is the duty of the Street Standards Committee to recommend to the City Planning Commission "minimum width and improvement standards for all classes of public and private streets and alleys". Pursuant to recently amended LAMC Section 12.37-A.5, the Street Standards Committee was called upon to establish guidelines for use by the City Engineer in the review of requests for waiver or reduction of public street dedication otherwise required under LAMC Section 12.37-A.1.

As part of its action in adopting Code amendments to LAMC 12.37-H, the City Council also amended LAMC 12.37-A by adding a new subsection - A.5 (Exhibit E-2). This new subsection enables the City Engineer to waive or reduce highway/collector street dedications otherwise required pursuant to LAMC 12.37-A.1. The new subsection calls for the City Engineer to base his determination regarding a waiver or reduction of required public street dedication "on guidelines established by the Street Standards Committee" which determine if additional street dedication is "necessary to meet mobility needs for the next twenty years". The new subsection also requires that a procedure be established for notification of "interested persons including the Councilmember of the district where the property is located" for this City Engineer determination.

Note that the City Engineer discretion created through LAMC 12.37-A.5 applies only to those developments subject to building permit issuance which would not otherwise be subject to any discretionary review i.e. development which does not exceed Site Plan Review thresholds as set forth in LAMC 16.05-C. Thus the scale of development involved is generally less than 50,000 sq. ft. of nonresidential floor area and less than 50 dwelling units or guest rooms for residential projects.

A Working Group of the Street Standards Committee was reconvened in May, 2000; the Working Group, composed of representatives of the respective general managers, met on a monthly basis until November. The results of the Working Group's deliberations were presented to the Street Standards Committee in December, 2000 in the form of the Guidelines/Checklist attached as Exhibit E-1. The Street Standards Committee approved and signed the Guidelines/Checklist in January, 2001.

### Discussion -

In summary, the Guidelines/Checklist (Exhibit E-1) establish a screening system for requests of waivers or reductions of required public street dedications. The Checklist enables Bureau of

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Engineering (BOE) counter staff to quickly assess potential dedication requirements, thereby expediting the processing of building permit applications for lots located on streets which are not yet fully dedicated to standard.

#### SCREEN I

\*scans for those streets for which dedication will ALWAYS be required

\*determines those streets for which a formal request for waiver/reduction will be considered and referred to LADOT

# **SCREEN II**

\*sets thresholds/rules for LADOT review of requests for waiver/reduction

\*includes statement of deadline for LADOT staff action on the request

The criteria for the screens are similarly based on adopted City policy and practical necessity. The primary screen (Screen I) includes street designations/types/facilities which were previously studied as part of the General Plan Framework and Transportation Element preparation process and for which eventual full improvement to standard is evidently needed (e.g. congested corridors, Transit Priority Arterials, streets with bikeways). This screen also includes commonsense situations for nonarterial (collector and local) streets where eventual full improvement is also evidently needed due to proximity to high capacity/high volume facilities and to likely driveway locations. For purposes of comparison, Screen I excludes all or portions of 82 of the 141 streets or street segments designated as Major Class II highways from consideration for waiver; it excludes all or portions of 58 of the 206 streets or street segments designated as secondary highways. The secondary screen (Screen II), which is applied to case-by-case review by LADOT staff, relates to current and/or projected traffic volumes as compared to performance criteria set forth in Chapter-VI of the Transportation Element for each of the respective street designations and configurations.

# Notification Procedure

A notification procedure for any cases involving City Engineer consideration of a waiver/reduction of street dedication was required by the City Council in its adoption of the Code amendment which created 12.37-A5. The following procedure is recommended (Transmittal II of Exhibit E-1): Once an applicant has filed a formal request to the City Engineer for a waiver or reduction of dedication, a notice describing the request will be sent to the adjacent property owners along the same street frontage and across the same street, as well as to the Councilmember of the district where the property is located. These same parties, along with the applicant, shall also receive a notice of determination from the City Engineer as to the outcome of the request. This recommendation is a reworking of the procedure previously utilized for General Plan Consistency determinations (Ordinance No. 159748). Note that the time restrictions stipulated for mailing of notices and processing of requests are based on accumulated experience from review of similar request by BOE and LADOT staff, and will not result in delay of processing of building permit applications.

## **Processing of Requests**

The Street Standards Committee has been exploring various means to further expedite the processing and review of these requests and to simplify the entire procedure for BOE and LADOT staff. Electronic file versions of the Checklist and waiver/reduction request forms are already being prepared, as are GIS map files of the primary screen attachments. One of the desired outcomes is that BOE public counter staff would be able to access the primary screen checklist in a GIS-map format through NavigateLA or another readily accessible program.

#### Conclusion

The Guidelines/Checklist (Exhibit E-1) including the Notification Procedure, enable the consistent implementation of LAMC 12.37-A.5 as adopted by City Council. As established by the Street Standards Committee, the Guidelines/Checklist are fully consistent with the purpose and goals of the Transportation Element of the General Plan.

# **Environmental Clearance**

On December 29, 2000 a categorical exemption (ENV-2000-5334-CE) was granted to these Guidelines pursuant to the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and Article III, Section 2, Subsection (m) of the City's CEQA Guidelines (actions which do not of themselves have an impact on the physical environment).

The attached transmittals (Transmittal I - Proposed Guidelines and Checklist; Transmittal II -Proposed Notification Procedure) were prepared pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 12.37-A5 and are hereby approved by the Street Standards Committee.

# PROPOSED GUIDELINES / CHECKLIST

Section 12.37-A of the Los Angeles Municipal Code requires dedication and improvement of public streets as a condition of building permit issuance for most development in multiple unit zones (the RD3 zone or less restrictive) and in all non-residential zones in those cases where the street is not fully dedicated and / or improved to those standards set forth in Standard Plan S-470-0.

The City Engineer is authorized to consider requests for waivers or reductions of the required dedication. In the event that a building permit applicant makes such a request, those requests will be reviewed in the following manner, utilizing the two screens provided.

SCREEN I - for initial review by BOE staff

SCREEN II - for referrals to LADOT staff

# PROPOSED NOTIFICATION PROCEDURE (dedication waiver/reduction)

### STEP I

Within five (5) calendar days of the receipt of a request to waive or reduce required public street dedication, BOE shall mail notice to:

- (1) Owners of property across the street or alley from the subject property;
- (2) Owners of property with frontage along the same street which have a common corner with or which abut the subject property;
- (3) Owners of property with frontage along the same street which have a common corner with or which abut any properties listed in (1) and (2) above; and
  - (4) The Councilmember of the district where the subject property is located.

A request to waive or reduce the required public street dedication for property located at [ADDRESS] has been received by the City Engineer. The request shall be reviewed by the Bureau of Engineering and by the Department of Transportation (LADOT). The public street dedication is required as a condition of building permit issuance pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 12.37-A. [STREET NAME] is classified as a [STREET DESIGNATION].
